Leslie Donovan called the meeting to order at 3:05 p.m.

Donovan asked for a review of the minutes from December 1, 2006 meeting. Margi Miranda made a motion to accept the minutes. Stephanie Martin seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Donovan asked Scott Frank to report on Best Student Essays. Frank said a few copies of the fall 2006 issue are still available. He said he has received three submissions for the spring 2007 issue. He said the submission deadline is March 2. Frank said he is working on getting the BSE Web page updated.

Donovan asked Monika Dziamka to report on Conceptions Southwest. Dziamka said she and her staff have chosen the literature to be included in the magazine. She said there will be 24 poems, 10 fictions pieces and two non-fiction works. She said there will be prizes for top submissions in different categories. She said she also has many photo submissions. Dziamka said she expects CSW to go to press by the first week in April. She said the CSW Web site is almost completed. Dziamka said she is working on getting the CSW application completed for GPSA budget proposal. She said she plans to set up a booth in the SUB to sell back issues.

Donovan asked Riley Bauling to report on the Daily Lobo. Bauling said that he has been working with the C&J Department to create an internship for students. He said the student interns would earn 3 credits per semester. He said they would be required to write five articles every two weeks. Bauling said he felt that the Daily Lobo did a great job covering the UNM Presidential candidates. Stephanie Martin thanked Riley for the GPSA coverage this year in the Lobo. Jim Fisher asked Bauling if there were any good Daily Lobo editor candidates for next year. Bauling said that there is at least one.

Donovan asked Fisher to give the Daily Lobo financial report. Fisher said through December 2006 revenue has increased by \$25,000 compared to last year. He said that the Lobo will probably break even by the end of the year.

Donovan asked for a discussion regarding the editors selection schedule. Board members discussed their available dates and when they would not be on campus. The discussion included the decision to change the Daily Lobo application deadline to March 30. Donovan said that Daily Lobo editor candidates will be interviewed on April 6. Carolyn Souther said that Banner ID numbers should replace student's social security numbers Banner ID on the editor application forms.

Donovan asked if there was any new business. Margi Miranda said that ASUNM is having a blood drive in the SUB on Feb 14 from 8:30a.m to 3 p.m.

The meeting adjourned at 3:40 p.m.
